> The petitioner is a not-for-profit organization, inter alia, geared towards protection and promotion of the expression of speech. The petitioner has brought to the notice of this Court, Notification dated 29-08-2006, and the Directive dated 25-05-2012.

The learned counsel contends that the Ministry of Information Technology has no legal authority to block websites and assume the role of a Regulator. The learned counsel further contends that the petitioner has sought information regarding such websites, which have been blocked, but the respondents have refused to provide the information. It appears to this Court that the Notification dated 29-08-2006, and the Policy Directive dated 25-05-2012, are, inter alia, in violation of Article 19-A of the Constitution. Moreover, the respondents have to explain as under what authority and law are they exercising the

powers of blocking websites. The questions raised need consideration. Admit.
